


### Key Questions

*Why is communion important to Christians?*

*What are the key features of the communion/Eucharist service and how do they link to the Bible passage?*

*How does the Last Supper link to the communion service?*

*How does baptism show belonging to the church and what symbols are connect with it?*

*Does having a shared special place help Christians to feel part of the group?*

*Is it important for Christians to show they belong? What do you feel is the best way of showing it?*

*Is communion the most important way of showing that someone is a Christian or do you think some of the other things Christians do are more important?*

### Key Content

*Being part of a group requires commitment and Christians show it in different ways.*

*For many Christians, **baptism** is the way of demonstrating commitment to the church, but as an event it doesn't leave a mark or a sign showing that someone is a Christian.*

***Communion**, also called **Eucharist**, the **Lord's Supper** or **Mass** is a **ritual** that is important to Christians.*

*The bread, representing the body of Christ, may be real bread or wafers. The wine represents Jesus' blood and may be real wine or grape juice. The **paten** is a gold or silver plate on which the bread is placed. The **chalice** is the special cup for the wine*

*The Bible teaches Christians about the way they should celebrate communion. There is a clear link between communion and to the **Passover meal**, which Jesus celebrated with his disciples at the **Last Supper**.*

*Jesus teaches what is expected of his followers—for example to love one another, love your neighbour as yourself and to love God*
