Dear Parents

As we now approach half term, I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of some of the events planned for November and early December.

Harvest

We hope you enjoyed attending our Harvest Festival Service in Church, the first event of the school year in the Christian calendar. The children really rose to the challenge and performed wonderfully in front of the audience. We were very grateful for your generous donations which were delivered to the Buckingham Food Bank.

Winter Uniform

In the second half of the Autumn term, children should wear their **Winter uniform.** This includes a **white school shirt and tie for all pupils,** rather than the Summer polo shirts or Summer dresses which should no longer be worn. All children also need a **pair of wellies and a coat** to wear at playtimes during the Winter months, and a hat and gloves if necessary.
