



Key Content and Vocabulary

Continent-One of the seven very large areas/land masses of the world: These are: **North America, South America, Europe, Asia, Africa, Oceania, Antarctic.** Europe is the continent in which we live.

Ocean– An ocean is a very large sea. There are 5 oceans in the World: **The Atlantic**, **the Pacific**, **The Indian**, **The Southern and the Arctic Ocean**.

The Equator-The Equator is an imaginary line through the middle of the Earth which splits the planet into the **Northern and Southern Hemisphere**.

North Pole-the Northern end of the world's axis

South Pole-the Southern end of the world's axis.

Axis-The axis is an imaginary line through the centre of the Earth, around which the planet rotates/turns.

Country-A land that is controlled by a single government. Countries can be large or small.

Capital city-The city from where the government runs the country. Our capital city is London.

Population-the total number of people living in a country, city or area.
