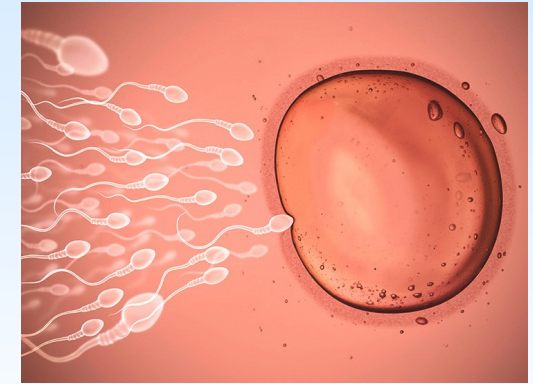
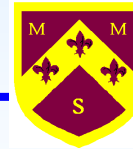

Growing and Changing



Puberty	When a child matures physically and the reproductive system becomes active.	Bladder	An organ inside the body where urine is stored.
Hormone	A chemical substance made in the body, which controls the activity of other cells and organs.	Conception	The process of conceiving a baby.
Uterus	Internal female organ in which a baby grows, also known as the womb.	Reproduction	The process by which living things create young or offspring.
Vagina	A canal that leads from the female uterus to the outside of the body.	Consent	To express willingness or approval.
Vulva	External female genitalia that surround the opening to the vagina.	Conceived	The fertilizing of an egg by a sperm; beginning of pregnancy.
Ovaries	A reproductive organ where eggs are produced.	Caesarean	The surgical delivery of a baby that involves making incisions in the mother's abdominal wall and uterus.
Fallopian tube	The tube where the female egg travels to the womb (uterus).	Foreskin	A retractable fold of skin that covers the glans of the penis.
Penis	A male organ which urine and sperm pass.	Cervix	The lower part of the uterus that opens into the vagina.
Testicles	Two male sex glands where sperm is produced.	Urethra	The tube that carries urine from the bladder out of the body.
Periods	A monthly bleed that females have, also known as menstruation .	IVF	Fertilising an egg outside the body, in a laboratory dish, and then implanting it in a woman's uterus
Fertilised	When a male's sperm enters a female's egg.	Anonymous question	When someone asks a question without revealing their Identity.
