I would like to wish you a warm welcome back to school following the Easter break. I hope you enjoyed the holiday and have had a relaxing break with your families. As we embark on the final term of this academic year I would like to bring to your attention some of the events which are due to take place before half term.

May Day Celebrations

The May King and Queen will be crowned in traditional fashion on Wednesday 8th May at our May Day celebrations. Children are already busy practising dances. We look forward to parents joining us for this occasion which starts at 1.30pm. On the day girls should wear their school summer dresses and white socks, and the boys should wear their yellow polo shirts and grey trousers or shorts with grey socks. Children in all classes should wear their normal black school shoes. Teachers will speak to the parents of the May King and Queen [Year 2], attendants [Year 2] and flower girl and boy [Reception] regarding their clothing requirements, once the elections have taken place. If the weather is looking uncertain, a decision will be made early on Wednesday morning and the event rescheduled for the following day.

Secondary school transfer, 11+ and Sex Education Presentation for Year 5 parents.

We will be holding an information evening for parents on the above on Monday 20th May at 7pm in the school hall. We strongly advise all Year 5 parents to attend. We are giving you lots of advanced notice of this meeting so that you can prioritise this, as this will be the only opportunity to receive this important information. NB this event is not suitable for children, so alternative arrangements should be made.

School Uniform

As we are now in the Summer term, the children should attend school dressed in the school <u>Summer</u> uniform as described below. Please note we have made some small changes from previous years to allow for greater flexibility for older girls.

Girls:

- Burgundy school cardigan
- Yellow checked summer dress. [KS1 and EYFS]. Girls in Key Stage 2 can wear the summer dress [preferred option] or yellow school polo shirt/white, short sleeved shirt, with a grey skirt or grey shorts].
- Low heeled school shoes (dark colour) with closed fronts [no trainers, boots or open toed sandals]
- White plain school socks

Boys:

- Grey trousers or shorts.
- Burgundy school jumper.
- Yellow school polo shirt.
- Sensible school shoes (dark colour) with closed fronts [no trainers or boots]
- Grey plain school socks

NB –all socks must be school socks and not patterned socks or those in other colours.



Clubs and extra curricular activities

This year we have introduced some very popular and successful lunchtime clubs for KS2. These have included to date, the KS2 choir with myself and Mrs Littlewood, the KS2 chess club with Mr Troup, and the KS2 touch typing club with Mrs Black, as well as various sporting clubs designed to prepare the children for the various sports competitions on the interschool sports' calendar. [netball, basket ball, tag rugby etc]

This half term, we will be running some new lunchtime clubs for KS1 children [Sparrows]. This includes a Monday lunchtime singing club with Mrs Reece and a Thursday lego club with Mrs Bristow. After half term, Mrs Griffiths will be running as story telling club. the As per the Key Stage 2 clubs, parents do not need to sign up, and all children wishing to attend, can do so. As part of learning about commitment, all we ask, is that children must commit to the whole half term.

Mrs Littlewood will be leading our KS2 production of Alice in Wonderland, and will send out a separate email giving details of after school rehearsal times for specific groups of children.

Walk to School Week – 20th-24th March

"Walk to School Week", will take place on the week beginning 20th May. This is the time of year when we encourage you to abandon your cars and walk to school each day! We will be holding a house competition to see which house has the highest number of children who travel to school sustainably [by walking, using the park and walk facilities or cycling].
