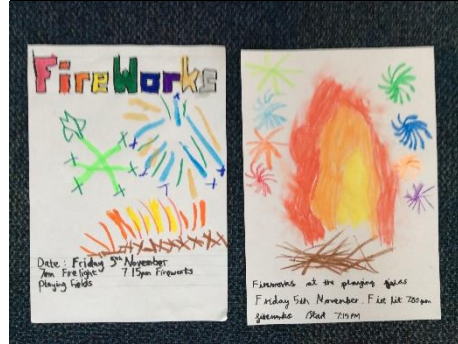
Promoting active and healthy life styles.

School Travel Plan - walk to school weeks, “bling your bike” to school weeks, spacious outdoor grounds with active play equipment, a Thriving forest school area, sports day, membership of sports’ partnership, before and after school, as well as lunch time sports clubs, visit from the dentist. Healthy eating such as morning fruit snack and milk, water throughout the day, healthy lunch boxes promoted. Hot lunch options nutritionally balanced.

Commemorating Remembrance Day at the village Rose Garden, decorating the village Rose Garden every Remembrance Day, finding out about the soldiers from MM who died in WW1, taking part in the annual Village Scarecrow competition, promoting the annual Bonfire night with posters, geography and history village walks.

Collaboration with Maids Moreton Hall Care Home.

In September 2018 we embarked on a collaborative project with Maids Moreton Hall Care Home in Maids Moreton. The project is designed to be mutually beneficial to both residents and children, promoting positive inter-generational social interaction. Examples include art workshops, pizza making, flower arranging, book sessions, carol singing, D Day commemoration, treasure hunts, Shrove Tuesday pancake tossing, seed planting and board games.



PTA events

Examples include the pancake breakfast, Mothers' and fathers's day craft events, Easter fun day, Christmas window wonderland, the children's Summer Fayre, the Santa float, the annual Mince Pie Making, the Christmas Fayre, the Platinum Jubilee tea party.

Examples include the Police, the ambulance service, dentists, vets, the RNLI, visiting authors.



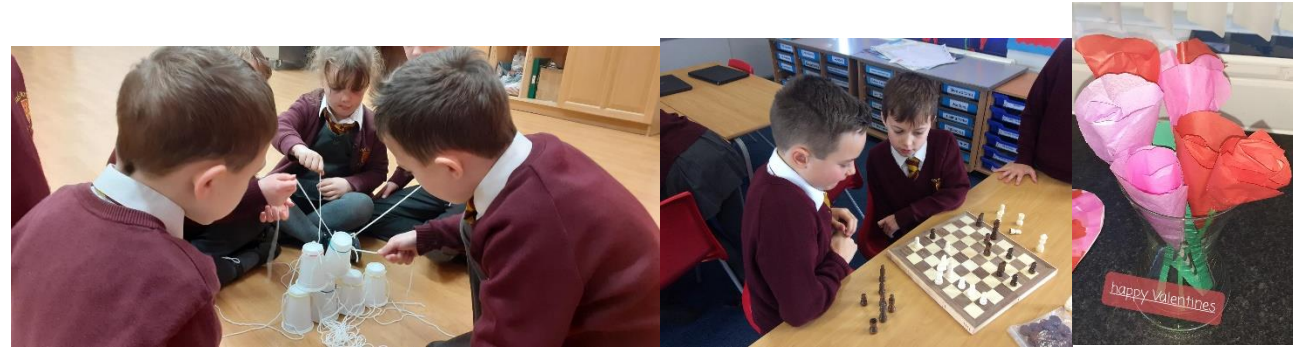
U3A Readers
