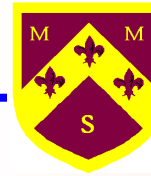

Key Vocabulary

Techniques used to manipulate paper* including: cut, place, arrange, twist, curl, fold, roll, tear, bend, fringing, pleating, spiraling, scrunching,

Recycle is using waste materials

Diorama is a 3D miniature scene

Freestanding is something that stands up on its own

Foreground - things that you see which are closest to you

Background - things that you see which are furthest away from you

Perspective is the art of making some objects or people in a picture look further away than others.

Pop art is a style of art based on simple, bold images of everyday items, or popular culture, painted in bright colours.

Portrait is a painting or drawing of a person

Digital art is a term for art that is made using digital technology

Sculpture is the art of making statues

Figurative is modern art based on the real world and real people.

Abstract art is modern art which does not represent images of our everyday world. It has colour, lines and shapes, but they are not intended to represent objects or living things
