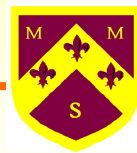

Key Content and Vocabulary

Coast The part of land near the sea.

Seaside resort A town or village on the coast where people go on holiday.

Sea Salt water covering most of the Earth's surface.

Beach A pebbly sand or shore next to the sea.

Shore The land along the edge of the sea.

Bay A place where the coast bends inwards and the sea fills the space.

Cliff A steep rock face close to the edge of the sea.

Harbour A place by the seaside where boats can stay safely in the water.

Pier A structure for people to walk along that is built out into the sea.

Promenade A paved, public walk way near to the sea front.

Dunes Hills or mounds of sand held together by plants.
