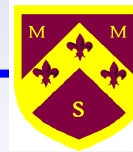




## Knowledge Organiser PSHE

#### First Aid



<b>Unresponsive</b>	Not reacting or responding to communication.	<b>Casualty</b>	A person badly affected by an event or situation.
<b>Unconscious</b>	Not awake and aware of and responding to one's environment.	<b>Life-threatening</b>	Capable of causing death.
<b>Conscious</b>	Awake, aware of what is happening around you, and able to think.	<b>Minor</b>	Lesser in importance, seriousness, or significance.
<b>Anaphylaxis</b>	A severe and potentially life-threatening reaction to a trigger such as an allergy.	<b>Allergic</b>	Having an allergy to a substance.
<b>Asthma</b>	A common lung condition that causes occasional breathing difficulties.	<b>Prescribed</b>	To officially advise someone to use a medicine or treatment.
<b>Obstruction</b>	Something that gets in the way, sticks out, or blocks passage.	<b>Treatment</b>	Medical care given to a patient for an illness or injury.
<b>Severe</b>	Very bad, serious, or unpleasant.	<b>Seizure</b>	A sudden, uncontrolled electrical disturbance in the brain.
<b>Emergency</b>	A serious, unexpected, and often dangerous situation requiring immediate action.	<b>Nauseous</b>	To feel sick in your stomach, as if you might vomit. Incident An event or occurrence.
<b>ABC</b>	This stands for checking a person's airway, breathing and circulation	<b>Scald</b>	A severe burn.
<b>CPR</b>	A procedure where you perform chest compressions if someone's heart has stopped beating and they are not breathing	<b>Heart attack</b>	A medical emergency when a blood clot or other blockage cuts blood flow to a part of the heart.
