Dear Parents and Carers,

On behalf of all the staff and governors, I welcome you back to the start of the new school year. I hope you have all had an enjoyable and relaxing holiday with your families and feel refreshed and ready for the Autumn Term. We are also delighted to meet our new Reception children and families, as well as 3 new children joining Magpies class, and 1 new child joining the Sparrows.

### Fruit for snack time

Children in Robins and Sparrows will receive a piece of fruit provided by the school at snack time each morning, as part of the government free fruit initiative for children in year groups R, 1 and 2. Children in Magpies and Kestrels should bring their own fruit. [fruit only please]

### Dates for Your Diary

Diary dates for the whole school year are now published on our school website under "News and Events-Diary Dates 2025-2026". You will be notified of any changes to the diary dates with as much notice as possible, should they occur. We try to keep any changes to a minimum.

### Secondary school transfer test

Children in Year 6 will sit the 11+ test on the morning of Thursday 11th September. They will also sit a practise test on Tuesday 9th September. Those children opting not to take the test, will remain with the Year 5 children as normal in class. It is important that all Year 6 children arrive punctually on these mornings as the tests will take place straight after registration. Results will be sent to parents after 4pm on Friday 10th October.

### **Sports Competitions/Extra curricular clubs and opportunities**

We are delighted to announce that as part of our commitment to provide competitive sporting opportunities for all year groups, and to provide our children with the social benefits of mixing with larger numbers of pupils from other schools, we have once again joined the S4A Group Sports Festival Programme. There will be 20 after school competitions, over the year. All events will take place at the Royal Latin School and Buckingham Primary School. Details will be sent to relevant year groups throughout the year.

S4A offer after school clubs from Monday-Thursday each week. These are open to all children, not just those needing wrap around care. They are booked directly through S4A. Staff run lunchtime clubs will also continue to run on rotation during the year.

For those of you new to Maids Moreton, our House system promotes a sense of friendly competition. Being part of a house also encourages a sense of belonging and pride, and provides our older pupils with the opportunity to support the younger ones, thereby learning the responsibility of becoming a good role model. Children are able to gain house points for many different academic and wider social achievements, as well as taking part in various inter house competitions throughout the year.

### **Book Bags.**

Please can I remind all parents not to put water bottles in book bags, as they have a tendency to leak causing irreversible damage to the books inside. Also, children should not attach soft toys, bulky key rings and other large trinkets to their book bags. Some are so large and numerous that it is difficult to fit the bookbags in the children's trays. In some instances, the weight of the attachments on the book bag handles is preventing them from shutting. Whilst we appreciate that it is helpful for our EYFS and Key Stage 1 children to have a small identifying feature on their book bag, this should be in the singular, and no larger or bulkier than the size of a small key ring. Children in Year 3 and above should not have any attachments on their book bags. Thank you for your support.

### **Arrival/Collection Arrangements**

Could I please remind all parents who drop their children off by car, not to park on the yellow zig-zag lines outside the school or on the bend at the top of Avenue Road. As part of our School Travel Plan we operate a "park and walk" facility. Parents who do not live within walking distance of the school are encouraged to park outside the church or at Maids Moreton Playing Fields car park so your child/ren can participate in the school's "Go for Gold" scheme. Both facilities are less than 5 minutes walking distance from school. Children are encouraged to walk to school and participate in the "Go for Gold" scheme, which rewards them for opting to walk, cycle or scoot to school. We will send a walk to school map home for our new children.

### **PTA**

Here at Maids Moreton, we are fortunate to have a small but enthusiastic PTA who work with such energy and commitment to support the children's education in so many ways and provide vital fundraising for the school. Last year, the money raised funded cookery and music equipment, used by children throughout the school, the new House trophies, the leavers' gifts and the Year 3 and 4 swimming lessons. This year, we plan to purchase a new piece of outdoor play equipment which encompasses a range of features which will appeal to the children. The PTA will also be funding experience days for all the children.

The PTA work hard to provide a range of fundraising opportunities and events. New parents are automatically "members", so please do come along to the first meeting. [Date, time and format to be confirmed]. I would like to take this opportunity to thank last year's committee, for their contribution to the school.

### **Meet the Teacher sessions**

In September we will be hosting "meet the teacher" sessions for parents from each class in their respective classrooms. The dates are as follows: Sparrows: Monday 8th, Magpies: Friday 12th and Kestrels: Friday 19th. All meetings will take place in the classrooms between 2.50pm-3.20pm. NB The parents of children in Robins class will receive a home visit instead of a meet the teacher session. We will also send out a termly curriculum forecast for each class, which outline details of the curriculum to be covered this term and other important information. These, alongside our detailed Knowledge Organisers, will also be available to view on the school website.

We also hold a phonics meeting for Reception [Robins] parents at the start of term. This will take place on Thursday 25th September at 2.50pm in the Reception classroom.

### **School lunches**

Please may we request that the parents of our younger children, select a menu option they know they would like to eat. Every year, we have small number of children who get very distressed at lunch time, unwilling to eat the lunch ordered. Whilst we can encourage them to try the food, we cannot force them eat it. Please consider an alternative option on the menu or provide your child with a packed lunch in these circumstances. Many thanks. Just a reminder to all parents that all children will need a packed lunch on 4th, 5th September and 24th October due to BMA insect days. Also, the deadline for ordering lunches for the w/c 8th September is 2nd September.

### **School Nut Policy**

Just a quick reminder regarding our school Nut Policy. We request that parents do not send food to school that contain nuts. This includes all types of nuts, peanut butter/paste, nutella and food containing nuts. Our hot meal providers also operate a no nut policy to the food they provide to our school. We have a child in school with a severe nut allergy so I would like to take this opportunity to remind the whole school community of the need to avoid nut products.

## Attendance

In this fourth year of normal education following the pandemic, we have successfully bucked the national trend, meeting the expected school attendance target of 96% for the academic year 2024-2025, with an overall school figure of 96.71%. This is to be commended and is in no small part thanks to the support of the vast majority of our parents.

Schools are required to track and analyse the individual attendance of all pupils on a termly basis and take action where required.

For the academic year 2024-2025-

67% of our children met or exceeded the 96% target

32% of pupils had attendance between 90% and 95.9%

1% of pupils had attendance below 90%

Attendance of less than 90% is categorized as persistent absenteeism, requiring significant improvement. This means that a child has missed the equivalent of 4 or more weeks of school during the academic year. Anything less than 95% is categorized as a cause for concern, that requires improvement, as the child has missed the equivalent of 2-4 weeks of school over the year.

Low levels of attendance produce gaps in education and make it hard for children to meet age group expectations and keep up with their peers both socially and academically.

We write to the parents of those children who fall in the persistent absentee category, where there was not a term on term improvement, or significant extenuating circumstances.

At the beginning of a new school year, may I also take the opportunity to refresh parents about the school's attendance policy. We are unable to authorise absences for family holidays taken during the school term time or isolated days off e.g. for birthdays or long weekends away. At the end of the Summer term, we always allocate a number of INSET days, allowing parents to take advantage of a more cost effective and earlier get away, before other schools have broken up. For example, this year, the children's last day was Friday 18th July, with 3 INSET days on the following Monday - Wednesday. We therefore do not expect children to leave during the week before to go on holiday.

We have also noticed a small number of families regularly not attending the last Friday [all day or afternoon] before half term holidays. The learning in classes continues until the close of the school day and those children who leave early, miss the end of half term topics, and the crucial final lesson of the block of teaching.

Any days off, or holiday taken during term time will be shown as an unauthorised absence on your child's records and could incur fines, issued by Buckinghamshire council. We appreciate that the holiday industry increase costs significantly outside term times. As staff who work in a school, we are well aware of the financial implications! Whilst we appreciate that the vast majority of parents respect our policy, I would ask all parents to consider carefully their holiday arrangements mindful of the negative impact it has on your child's education. Due to the structure of the curriculum, if a child misses a full week of school, they may well miss a vital block of their lifelong learning, particularly in subjects such as maths. It is especially important to avoid May and June, as these are the times when the internal and external end of year assessments take place. When children miss these, they tend to perform less well when doing the tests on their own, after a period of absence from school, when their learning is less fresh.

If your child is poorly, we request you let the school know as early as possible, by parentmail or by telephone, using the answering service if no-one is available to take your call. We have a guide on our school website, from the NHS, indicating the recommended amount of absence for common childhood illnesses. If your child is not present for morning registration, the school office staff will telephone you if we have not received an explanatory message.

An attendance guide for parents can be found on our school website. We aim this year, to work towards eliminating any persistent absenteeism, and ensuring as many children as possible reach the required 96% target. Thank you for your support.

### Whole class reading texts for KS2

Please can I remind all parents to ensure your child brings their copy of the whole class reading text to school ready for the first day of term. Details of the texts required were sent out before the holidays.

### The school day

Just a reminder that all children should be lined up on the playground ready to come in at **8.50am** and we will be ready to be picked up at **3.20pm**. If your child is in Year 6, and your arrangements have changed for the days they walk to or from school independently, please let us know.

### Uniform



Thank you for your continuing support regarding school uniform. Visitors often comment that our children look very smart indeed! Until October half term, children can choose to wear their Summer or Winter uniform depending on the weather. Please could we request that all items, including PE kit, are clearly named, so that any lost items can be quickly returned to the rightful owners. We have a lost property box located in the lobby between the Kestrels and Magpies classrooms. All children also require wellies and waterproofs from the start of the year to access the Forest School's area and to go on the field at playtimes and lunchtimes. Children should come in PE kit on the days they have PE. [Friday for Robins, Tuesday and Friday for Sparrows, Monday and Friday for Kestrels and Wednesday and Friday for Magpies]. Sun hats are also required during hot weather.

### School visits

We plan visits which take place over the school year. The timing of these visits coincides with what the children are learning at that particular moment, and are used to enhance and enrich the children's experiences within the curriculum. There are a number of visits planned for the first half of the Autumn term. Parents in Sparrows, Magpies and Kestrels have received separate letters about these visits prior to the Summer break.

### New Parents Afternoon Tea

Just a reminder, that this informal event will take place on Friday 26th September from 2.30m-3pm in the school hall. We do hope you can join us for a cuppa and a chat.

### Year 6 cake sale

The first cake sale of the Year [Year 6], will take place after school on Friday 17th October on the school playground. Please bring some loose change if you wish to make a purchase.

We look forward to another successful year at Maids Moreton, working in close partnership with our families.
