

Computer Safety



Online relationship	A relationship between people who have met online, and in many cases know each other only via the Internet.	Posting	A piece of writing, image, or other item of content published online.
Online bullying	Bullying which takes place over digital devices, such as phones, tablets, and computers.	False content	Content published online that is false or misleading.
Device	A piece of portable electronic equipment that can connect to the internet, such as a smartphone, tablet, or laptop computer.	Image sharing	The act of sending or posting an image online.
Insulting	Something that is rude, offensive, or disrespectful.	Rumours	A story or statement that is being passed around without confirmation that it is actually true.
Social media sites	An online platform which people use to build social networks or social relationships with other people.	Age restriction	An age under or over which something can or cannot be done.
