## House Events

Children all belong to one of four houses:

Rose  
Daffodil  
The houses were named by the children, with the emblems and logos also created by them:  
e.g. Rose "we bloom as a bunch". Daffodil "Stand tall, be proud and shine."

Children take great pride in representing their house in a range of events such as netball, cricket, rounders, as well as the house art, house quizzes and house chess competition



**Active citizenship**

School council and school council events, such as hot dog day, pancake breakfast, voting for village play park equipment, tree planting with MM Conservation Group, dog fouling posters, supporting traffic calming and conservation matters in village. Enterprise project.



**Charity work**

Supporting local national and world wide charities such as the Akwaaba Foundation, Diabetes UK, hypo hounds, Ukraine, Children in Need, The Royal British Legion, Comic Relief, Sports Relief, the Buckingham Food Bank, NSPCC number day, Save the Children [Christmas Jumper Day].



**Community involvement**

Active member of village allotments with own plot. Taking an integral role in local events such as the Great Fire of Buckingham commemoration, supporting the local food bank, Buckingham garden centre events, singing at the village soup kitchen, village scarecrow day.



**Curriculum  
Enrichment Visits**

Visiting places of local and national interest to enrich and deepen curricular learning e.g. Gawcott solar farm, Pregos pizza making, the MK mosque, MK Romans, Stone Age, Ancient Egypt and Vikings visits, The Buckingham Old Gaol, The Oxford National History Museum, Stowe and Waddesdon National Trust grounds, MK history museum, the Safety Centre, Whipsnade Zoo, Cotswold Wildlife Park, Holdenby House, Year 5/6 residential visit, Year 3 and 4 campover.



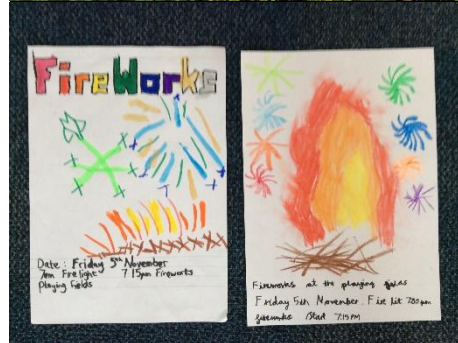
**Promoting active and healthy life styles.**

School Travel Plan - walk to school weeks, “bling your bike” to school weeks, bikeability, spacious outdoor grounds with active play equipment, a Thriving forest school area, sports day, membership of sports’ partnership with interschool competitions, athletics and cross country championships, lunch time sports clubs, visit from the dentist. Healthy eating such as morning fruit snack and milk, water throughout the day, healthy lunch boxes promoted. Hot lunch options nutritionally balanced.



**Full participation  
in village life.**

Commemorating Remembrance Day at the village Rose Garden, finding out about the soldiers from MM who died in WW1, taking part in the annual Village Scarecrow competition, promoting the annual Bonfire night with posters, geography and history village walks.



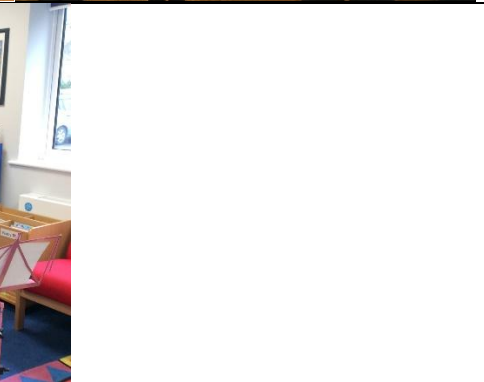
**Integral part of the life of the church and the events of the Christian calendar.**

**Collaboration with Maids Moreton Hall Care Home.**

In September 2018 we embarked on a collaborative project with Maids Moreton Hall Care Home in Maids Moreton. The project is designed to be mutually beneficial to both residents and children, promoting positive inter-generational social interaction. Examples include art workshops and crafts, singing, dancing, cookery, flower arranging, reading, D Day commemoration, gardening and board games.



**PTA events and experience days.**

Examples include Safari Stu, the magician, Mothers' and fathers' day craft events, Easter fun day, Easter bunny trail, the children's Summer Fayre, the Christmas window wonderland, the Santa float, the annual Mince Pie Making, the Platinum Jubilee tea party.



**Visitors to school**

Examples include the police, the fire brigade, the ambulance service, music workshop, dentist, vets, Chinese New Year visitor, history visitors. [e.g. toys in the past]



**U3A Readers**

Retired persons from the U3A attend school to read with the children. [both men and women as role models for reading]



**Extra curricular clubs after school and during the lunch hour.**

Examples include choir, a variety of sports, chess, touch typing, lego, crafty creations, ballet, story telling, cooking, games.
