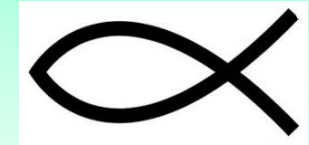
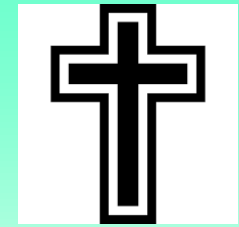
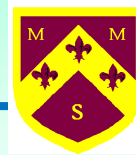

Belonging [Christianity]



Key Vocabulary

Christianity—the religion followed by Christians

Christian—a person who follows the religion of Christianity

Faith—having a religious belief.

Bible—The Christian Holy Book

Cross/Crucifix—a symbol of Christianity. Jesus died on the Cross

Ichthus—a symbol of Christianity in the shape of a fish

Dove—a symbol of Christianity in the form of a bird which brings peace.

Baptism—the ceremony in which people of any age from babies to adults are **baptised/christened** and become Christians

Holy Communion— this is a way for Christians to say thank you to God for Jesus' life by sharing the bread and wine.

Key Questions

What groups do I belong to and how do they make me feel?

How do people show they belong to a religion? [Christianity]

What happens at a Christian baptism?

What similarities and differences do you notice between the Jewish and Christian belonging rituals?

Key Content

We all belong to different groups which makes us feel special and give us a sense of community and belonging. For example our school, our family, Rainbows, Beavers, the Church.

Christians believe in God and follow the values and beliefs of Christianity.

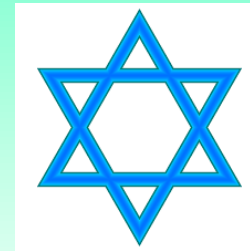
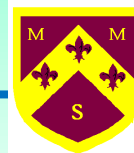
There are many outward signs of belonging to Christianity, including the Cross, the Crucifix, the Ichthus [fish] and the dove. Each symbol has its own special meaning.

Belonging [Judaism]



Key Vocabulary

Judaism—the religion followed by Jews.

Jew—a person who follows the religion of Judaism

Hebrew—another word for **Jewish**

Star of David—a symbol of Judaism in the shape of a star.

Tallit— the prayer shawl worn by Jewish people

Menorah— a seven branch Hebrew candle made of Gold, which is important to Jewish people

Bar Mitzvah—a Jewish ceremony which takes place when boys reach the age of 13.

Bat Mitzvah - a Jewish ceremony which takes place when girls reach the age of 12 years and 1 day.

Synagogue—the Jewish Church

Key Content

Jews believe in God and follow the values and beliefs of Judaism.

There are many outward signs of belonging to Judaism, including the Star of David, the menorah and the tallit. Each symbol has its own special meaning.

Jewish boys have a special welcoming ceremony called a Bar Mitzvah which happens at the Synagogue when they reach the age of 13.

Jewish girls have a special welcoming ceremony called a Bat Mitzvah which happens at the Synagogue [Jewish church] when they reach the age of 12 years and 1 day.

There are similarities and differences in the beliefs, values, rules and practices of belonging for Christians and Jews.
